

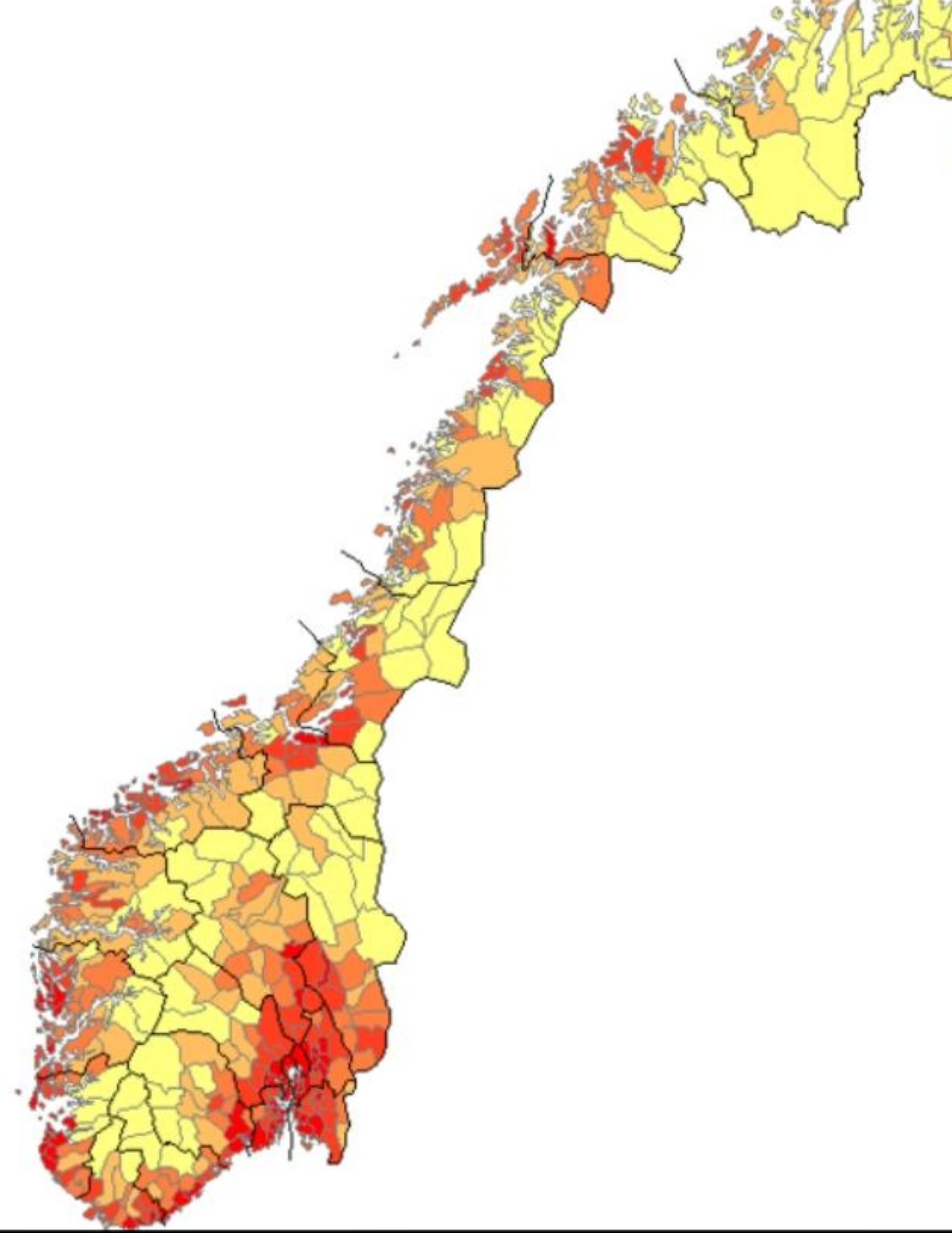


# Norway

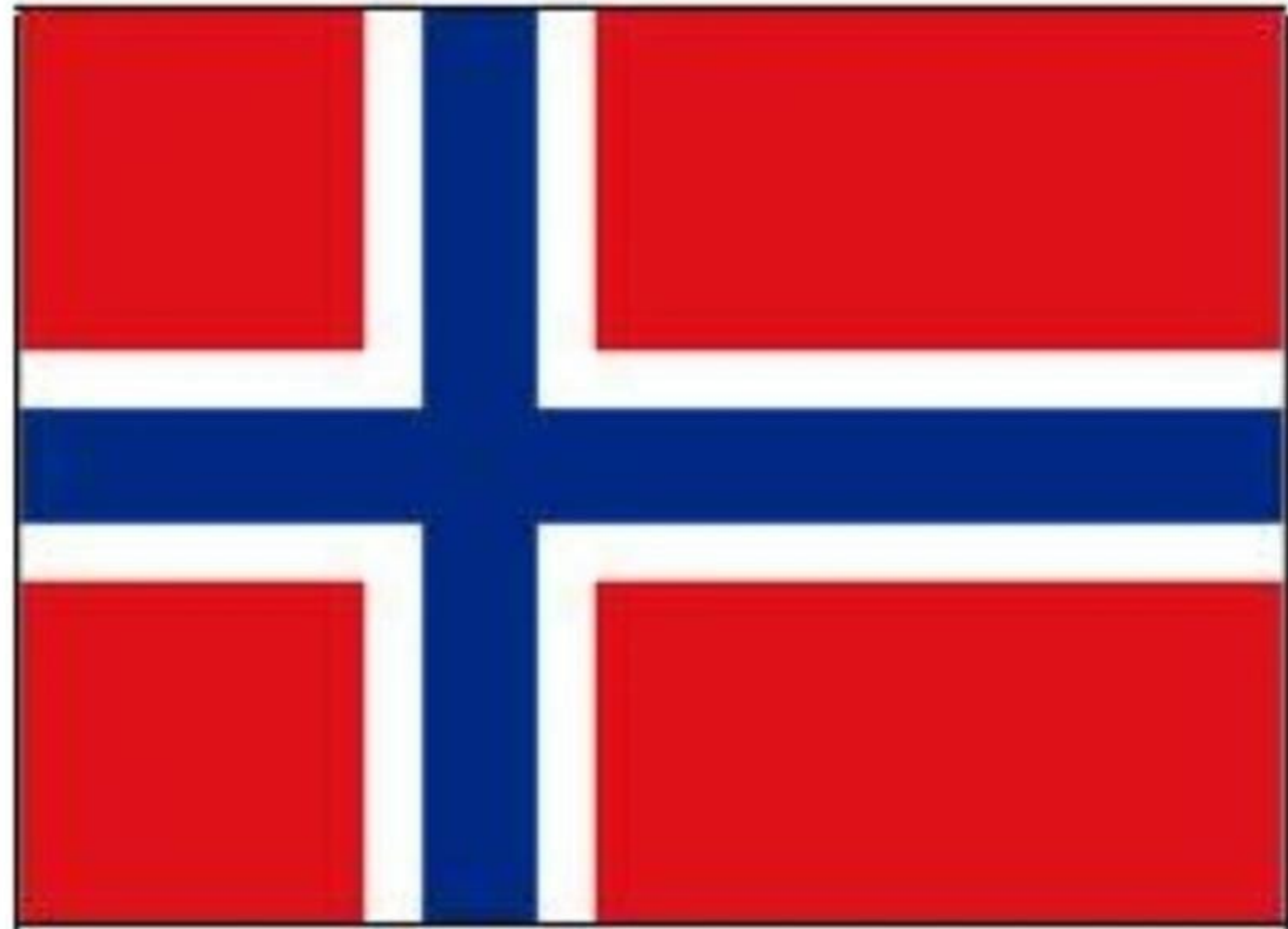
**Where Is Norway? Norway is located in northern Europe, on the Scandinavian peninsula. It borders Russia in the north, Finland and Sweden in the west, Norway. In the west, the country has coasts on the Norwegian Sea, which is in the Atlantic Ocean.**



**The Norwegian common, adopted in 1899, consists of the colors red, white and blue. The official flag of the country bears similarities with the flag of Denmark, another Scandinavian country. The white cross on it represents Norway's national unity and independence, while the white cross symbolizes Christianity. The country consists of a total of 19 states and 96 cities.**



**The Norwegian flag is a blue cross on a red background, surrounded by white, extending to the corners of the flag; The horizontal part of the cross is shifted towards the forward side of the flag, just like the Danish flag. ... The meaning of the flag is; The white cross on a red background represents Denmark and the blue cross represents Christianity**



# 1. Oslo



**Oslo is Norway's capital and most populated city. Hosting 40 islands and 343 lakes within the city limits, Oslo is a place where you can trace the traces of civilization with its historical textures, cobbled streets, regional architecture and religious structures. You can also enjoy natural activities with fjords, forests and mountains.**

## 2. Bergen



**Although Bergen is the second largest city in Norway, it is at the crossing point of those who want to visit the western fjords. Bergen, a port city that has existed since the Middle Ages, is also the starting point of fjord tours**

### 3. Lofoten Adaları



**The Lofoten Islands are located in the Nordland region of Norway, north of the polar circle. Lofoten Islands, one of the most valuable touristic regions with their mind-blowing natural beauties, covers an area of 1,425 square kilometers in the region that is inserted into the Atlantic Ocean by land.**

## 4. Tromso ve Kuzey Işıkları



**Tromso is a Norwegian city located 350 km north of the Arctic Circle. In the city, which is located in the region where the Northern Lights are most likely to be seen in the world with the light dances in the bright sky during the period from September to March, the air temperature can drop to minus 24 degrees in the winter period**



## 5. Preikestolen ve Trolltunga



**Preikestolen (Pulpit Rock) is a fascinating cliff that people from all over the world climb in about one to three hours to look at the same view.**

**Located at an altitude of 604 meters from the ground, Preikestolen is a region consisting of a monolithic rock, visited by approximately 150 thousand people a year**

## 6. Alesund



**Alesund is a port city in the Sunnmøre region of Norway.**

**Although many places were destroyed by the great earthquake in the city in 1904, it is possible to see the northern interpretation of Art Nouveau architecture in the city center, which was rebuilt in accordance with the original.**

**Famous for its Jugendstil architecture, the area is the gateway to Norway's west coast, northwest fjords and Alpine mountains.**

## 7. Reine



**Reine is the country's most famous fishing town, located approximately 1,300 km north of Oslo. The town, which is added to the list of places to visit by many people who plan to travel to Norway with photo sharing on social media, was chosen as the most beautiful village in the country in the late 1970s by Norway's largest magazine Allers.**

## 8. Flam



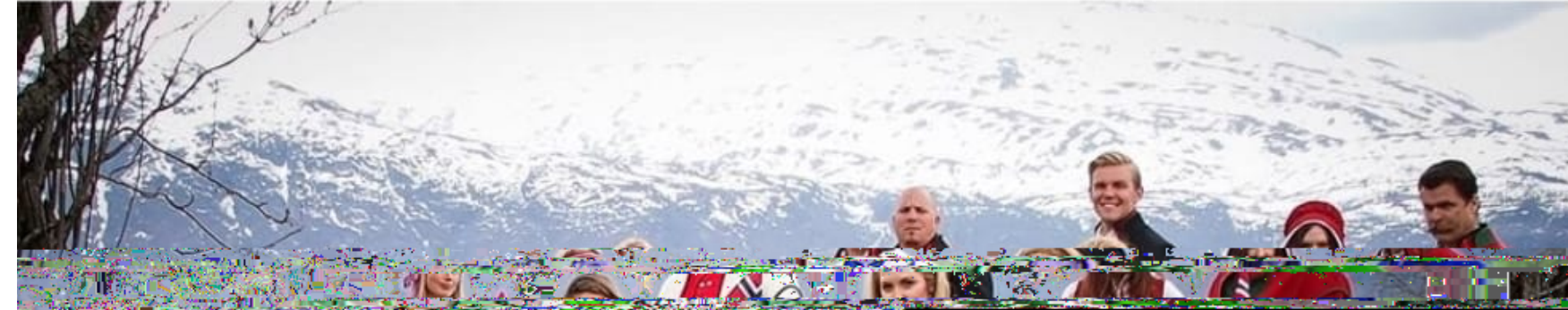
**Flam is a small fishing village on the shores of Sognefjord, one of Norway's deepest fjords, adorned with pristine waterfalls, rivers and lush forests, 370 km from Oslo. It is also possible to reach the village, which is built against the unique view of the fjords, by the legendary Flam Train of Norway.**

## 9. Svalbard



**There are good reasons why Svalbard is called the end of Europe. So much so that this archipelago is the northernmost inhabited place in the world, located between the Arctic Ocean, the Barents Sea, the Greenland and the Norwegian Sea. Svalbard, where the sun never rises in winter and never gets dark in summer, is one of the best places to see the northern lights.**

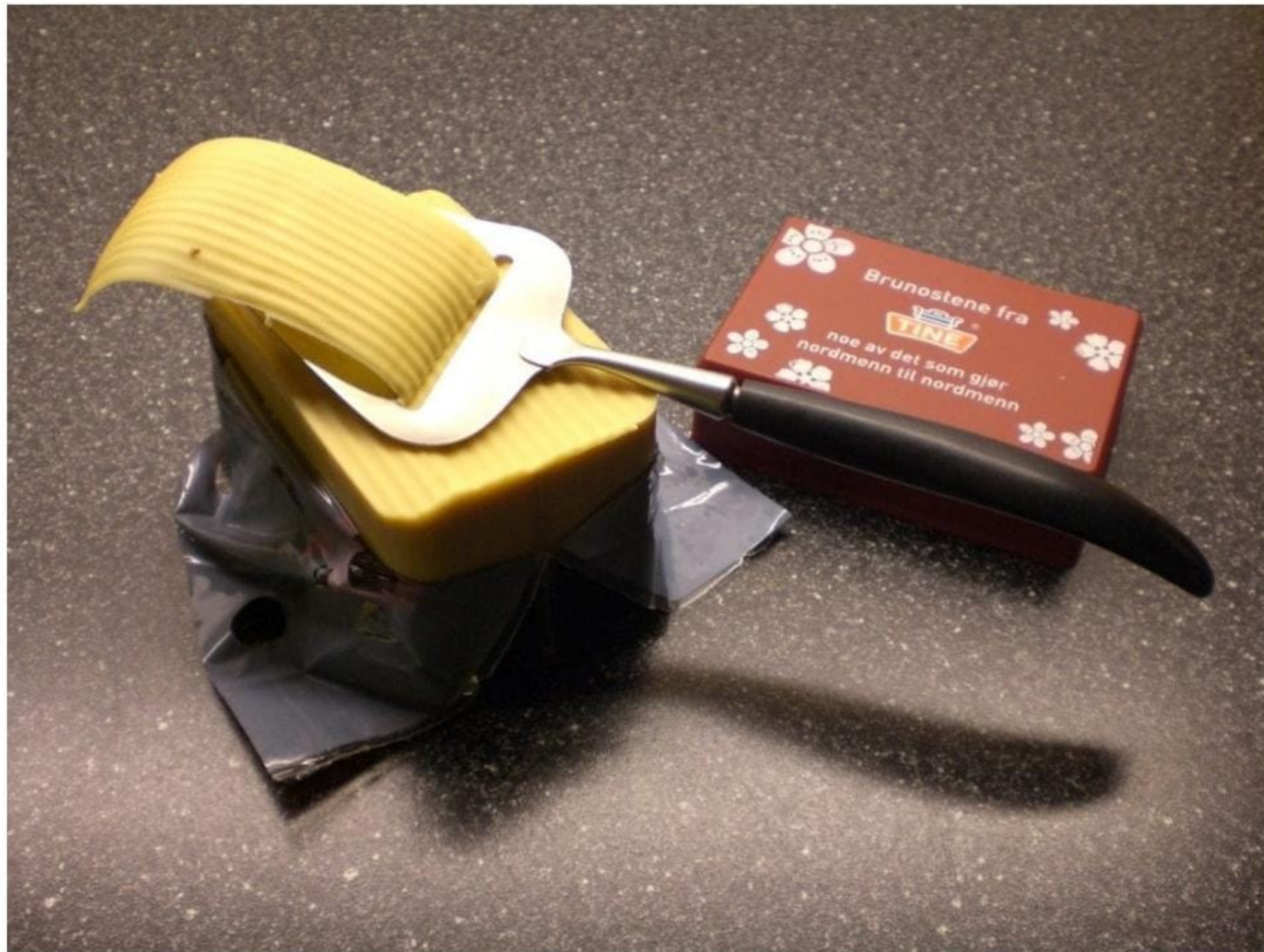

# 1- Brunost (Kahverengi Peynir)



**Brunost, which Norway should be famous for, is one of the four describing varieties. It is one of the most famous in Norway, which has a different taste with its color and smell**



## **2- Flatbrød**



**The name of this snack, which is prepared with the addition of sour cream, jam and a choice of meat on top of dried cereals, is called Flatbrød. Quite delicious canapé-like snacks are among the favorite foods of Norwegians**

**It is also useful to ask about the meat content while trying the sausages made from pork. On the other hand, many sauces and spices are optionally added to the tiny sandwiches**
